To prospective Sixth Form Entrants

Thank you for enquiring about entry to our Sixth Form in September 2018. I have pleasure in enclosing a Sixth Form booklet (which sets out the subjects available in the Sixth Form) and an application form.

You need to complete the Applicant's Section of the form (on the front page and page 2) and then pass it on to Head of Year 11 at your present school who will be able to complete the reference section on pages 3 and 4. You should ask your school to send the completed form on to us as soon as possible.

In completing your section of the Form, you will need to choose three A Level subjects and a reserve.

From September 2018, candidates will be required to achieve 54 points in their best 8 GCSEs, including level 6s in English (language or literature) and Mathematics. At least 3 must be at level 7 or higher, in the subjects wished to be taken at A-Level. If you wish to study biology, chemistry or physics, you are expected to achieve a minimum of grade 7 in separate science GCSEs or a double 7 grade for any form of double award science exam. If you have taken the first part of a double award exam at the end of Year 10 and gained below a 7 grade, you will not be eligible to study science subjects here (unless you are planning to resit the examination to gain a 7-9 grade). You are also required to achieve an 8/9 in maths to study further maths

Whatever subjects you wish to study at A Level, you must secure at least grade B in GCSE maths and English.

Early application is encouraged. The deadline for the receipt of applications for admission in September 2018 is 2nd February 2018. We will make a decision by mid-February and will notify applicants shortly afterwards. We will, however, be making early offers to exceptional candidates. There will be an opportunity for candidates who are made a conditional offer to meet current students and the Senior Leadership Team and to ask any questions they might have. The offer of a place will be conditional on the achievement of specified GCSE grades.

We are willing to consider applications received after the 2^{nd} February 2018. However, we expect that some subjects will be over-subscribed and it will be necessary to place later applicants on a late applicant waiting list. Any applicants who apply after the closing date will be considered after those made a conditional offer and those on the waiting list who applied within the 2^{nd} February deadline.

We recognise that choosing to change schools after Year 11 is a big decision; if you have any queries you can contact Mr Matley, the Head of Sixth Form, at the school.
