## A message from the Head of School, September 2017

Dear parents/guardians

### Welcome and reflections

It seems a long time since the summer holidays, but I hope everyone had a good break and has returned into the rhythm of school life. A particular welcome to the parents of the new starters (mainly in Year 7 and 12); I hope you find your association with QMGS as fulfilling as your son/daughter. Don't forget the **quiz social event** on Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> October for all new parents. This is being run by the **QMA** and I hope you can come along to meet new people and see how you can help the school.

I wrote in my press releases in the summer how pleased I was with our performances at GCSE and A-level, amidst change and uncertainty on a national scale. Our students have (as they always do) risen to the challenges thrown at them. Following on twitter the exploits of the teams on expedition in Borneo, army camp at Nesscliff and cadet programmes in Canada made me very proud (if not a little jealous!). If you haven't already, have a look at the school accounts on twitter and keep up with the life of the school. The main account is **@qmgs1554** and there are accounts to follow from lots of other areas of school life.

### Policy changes

We have made a few tweaks to some school policies, in order that we continue to provide the highest standard of education for the students.

The first one relates to the **Behaviour policy**, which you can find attached to this email. We have appointed Mr Farnell as a pastoral support assistant, working alongside the heads of year and Mr Saran across year 7-11. We have also introduced a behaviour points system and ladder of sanctions (available as appendices in the policy), which all students should be aware of.

We have also made changes to our policy on **Homework**. In key stages 3 and 4, the students should still receive one hour per subject per fortnight, but we have taken away the timetable (stating which days each subject can be set on). Subjects may set more than one piece in the fortnight (up to the limit of one hour), but still have to stick to the rule of two days to complete the work. We are currently collating a database of extension tasks and independent learning activities per subject. These activities can supplement homework which is set (if one hour per fortnight is not possible) and provide a range of opportunities for students to work beyond the curriculum. At this time of year, we are working with the upper sixth to complete their UCAS applications and the importance of wider, independent reading and research here cannot be overstated.
